CECF is offering its first annual conference in San Diego, CA to American high school students and ECA grant exchange students studying in the U.S. under the auspices of the Department of State's exchange programs.

Overview:

Youth are the hope of each nation, and the future of the world's civilization is soon to rest in their hands. The most pressing issue they face today is how to view the "Other." The threat of terrorism has brought with it a lot of fear, prejudice, hatred and suspicion of the "Other", which we aim to examine, discuss and transcend.

Better Understanding for a Better World began in 2006 with an annual conference in Orlando, FL. In 2008, CECF expanded this unique opportunity and included an annual conference in Baltimore, MD. After two more thriving years of BUBW Conferences in both Orlando and Baltimore, CECF is now expanding to include an annual BUBW Conference in San Diego, CA. These conferences were developed to bring together American high school students of diverse faiths and cultural backgrounds with international exchange students currently studying in the U.S. The conferences have been tremendously successful and each year the students benefit in ways that are truly impressive.

Conference Mission:

- Facilitate mutual understanding and appreciation between students from diverse regional, economic, social, religious, cultural and ethnic backgrounds.
- Learn about and discuss the practice of religion and faith in a pluralistic society with the objective of promoting tolerance, mutual respect, and an awareness of common values.
- Introduce various aspects of leadership, including those involving business and entrepreneurship.
- Forge ties of friendship between American high school students and students from around the world.

While the focus of the conference is principally on Judaism, Christianity and Islam, participation is open to all faiths, as well as those who may not be active in a particular faith tradition.

Follow up after the Conference: Students will be encouraged to maintain contact with each other and make a presentation in their schools or communities on the issues discussed during the conference.

Participants and Selection:

American and International high school students are expected to attend. International exchange students will represent the following programs sponsored by the Department of State: Future Leaders Exchange (FLEX), Youth Exchange and Study (YES), Congress Bundestag Youth Exchange (CBYX), American Serbia and Montenegro Youth Leadership Exchange (A-SMYLE) and others. Exchange students will be nominated by their exchange organizations and American students will be nominated by a staff member of their respective high schools or community /youth group leader.

Brief Conference Outline:

Wednesday, February 3, 2010:

Students should plan to arrive between 3:00 – 7:00 pm. Shortly thereafter they will enjoy a pizza social, ice breaking activities and a brief orientation.

Thursday, February 4, 2010 will include:

1. Main address “**The Role of Youth within the Family of Adam and Eve,**” elaborating on the need for “**Crossing the Divide,**” while developing an atmosphere of belonging, as well as cultural understanding and sensitivity, which leads to successful business interactions
2. Discussion about “**The Reality of Our World and How Ignorance and Stereotypes Cause Conflict and Failure**”
3. Student presentations (**Student Volunteers**)
4. Workshop on “**Leadership and the Importance of Youth Involvement**”
5. Breakout sessions, group discussions identifying problems facing the youth of today and ideas /activities for better cooperation on a personal, local and global level
6. Evening recreational time in **Balboa Park**

Friday, February 5, 2010 will include:

1. Visit local places of worship like a mosque, synagogue, and church. Students will experience first hand similarities and differences within the house of Abraham.
2. The visits will be followed by a panel discussion with the religious leaders involved in the day’s program.
3. Special Free-time Activities

Saturday, February 6, 2010 will include

1. Free-time in Sea World
2. Banquet and Certificate Ceremony in the evening with a focus on “**The American Experience: Learning About Each Other and Respecting Our Cultural Differences.**”

Sunday, February 7, 2010 will include:

1. Farewell discussion and wrap up following breakfast, including reflections and reactions to the program.
Students should try to schedule their departing flights between 10:00 am – 2:00 pm.
