CECF is offering its 39th annual BUBW Conference in Baltimore, MD to American high school students, International students and International Exchange students studying in the U.S. under the auspices of the Department of State's exchange programs.

Overview:

Better Understanding for a Better World (BUBW) began in 2006 with an annual conference in Orlando, FL. In 2008, CECF expanded this unique opportunity and included an annual conference in Baltimore, MD. After two more thriving years of BUBW Conferences in both Orlando and Baltimore, CECF expanded once more to include an annual BUBW Conference in San Diego, CA in 2010. These conferences were developed to give American high school students and exchange students currently studying in the U.S. the opportunity to meet students of diverse backgrounds. They have been tremendously successful each year and the students benefit in ways that are truly impressive.

Youth are the hope of each nation, and the future of the world's civilization is soon to rest in their hands. The most pressing issue they face today is how to view the **"Other"**, people who are different from you. CECF aims to transcend the fear of the "other" through multicultural and interfaith dialogue and mutual respect and understanding.

Conference Vision / Mission / Objectives:

- Facilitate mutual understanding and appreciation between students from diverse regional, economic, social, religious, cultural and ethnic backgrounds
- Discuss stereotypes about the "other" and their impact
- Learn about and discuss the practice of religion and faith in a pluralistic society with the objective of promoting tolerance, mutual respect, and an awareness of common values
- Introduce various aspects of leadership, including those involving business and entrepreneurship
- Forge ties of friendship between American high school students and students from around the world

While the focus of the conference is principally on Judaism, Christianity and Islam, participation is open to students of all faith backgrounds, as well as those who may not follow one.

Follow up after the Conference:

Students will be encouraged to maintain contact with each other and make a presentation in their schools or communities on the issues discussed during the conference.

American and Exchange Student Participants and Selection:

American and International high school students are encouraged to attend. International exchange students represent the following programs sponsored by the Department of State: Future Leaders Exchange (FLEX), Youth Exchange and Study (YES), Congress Bundestag Youth Exchange (CBYX) and other exchange programs. Exchange students will be selected by their sponsoring organizations and American students will be recommended by a staff member of their respective high schools or community / youth group leaders.

Brief Conference Outline

Wednesday, April 7: (Arrival, Dinner Social, Ice Breaking Activities and Orientation)

➤ **Arrival - Students are requested to arrive to the BWI Airport between 3:00 – 6:00 PM.**

Thursday, April 8: (International Youth Summit focusing on Diversity & Cultural Understanding and Leadership)

- Main address and Interactive Discussion about “The World Today: The Family of Adam and Eve,” elaborating on the need for “Crossing the Divide.”
- An International Youth Summit to discuss the importance of:
 - developing an atmosphere of belonging
 - cultural understanding, sensitivity and respect
 - problems youth face around the world and ways to resolve these conflicts
- Workshop on “Leadership and the Importance of Youth Involvement”
- Student Country Presentations by students who represent various continents and share a short informative ppt

Friday, April 9: (Interfaith Visits and Panel Discussion, followed by Free-Time)

- Visit local places of worship like a church, synagogue, and mosque. Students will gain first-hand experience of the similarities and differences within the house of Abraham
- Panel Discussion
- Visit to Washington, DC

Saturday, April 10: (Global Citizenship & Networking Session, Aquarium and Banquet & Certificate Ceremony)

- Global Citizenship and Networking for the Future
- Visit to the Baltimore National Aquarium
- Banquet, Student Performances, Keynote Address and Certificate Ceremony

Sunday, April 11: (Wrap Up & Departure)
